INTRODUCTION

Vermont is a rural state located between the large metropolitan areas of Boston, New York and Montreal. The Vermont economy depends on a diversified mix of manufacturing, private education, health care, tourism, professional services and public sector employers. Agriculture remains an important component of the state's economy and cultural image.

The Vermont labor force grew steadily at the start of the new millennium culminating in the attainment of an all-time high in early 2011. For the early part of the decade (2000-06), jobs mirrored the growth witnessed in the labor force. However due to the global economic downturn, Vermont witnessed a divergence in job creation and labor force participation. The differential resulted in increased unemployment as Vermont's unemployment rate peaked at 7.2% in 2009. Since that time, the statewide unemployment rate has steadily declined. Over the last 12-months, both the state and the national unemployment rate have improved modestly with Vermont at 4.7% (June 2012) still considerably less than the national average (8.2%). Much of the recent decline to the unemployment rate is attributable to a declining labor force as the economic reasons which kept individuals engaged in the labor force during the heart of the recent economic downturn have abated as time has passed. The 'Great Recession' officially ended in June 2009; though the subsequent national economic expansion has lost steam as of late.

In northwestern Vermont, Chittenden County provides nearly one third of the state's jobs and serves as the economic hub of the Vermont economy. Burlington and South Burlington make up the core

of the state's only Metropolitan Statistical Area. The area employs thousands of workers in retail, construction, manufacturing, education, health care and tourism industries. The MSA extends into parts of Franklin, Grand Isle and Addison counties.

Southern Vermont has worked to maintain a balance between economic development and preservation of the rural working landscape. Easy access from northeastern urban centers (Boston, New York City, etc.) has put pressure on the region for second home development. In addition, ski resorts in the area have expanded to provide self-contained winter recreation facilities. The area along the Connecticut River has close ties to neighboring New Hampshire communities. The northern part of Windsor County benefits from its proximity to Hanover, New Hampshire, which employs many workers in education and health care.

Bennington County, in the southwestern corner of the state, provides a wide range of recreation and tourist activities. It is a popular area with visitors from adjoining New York State. The county also is home to many manufacturing, retail and health care employers.

While central Vermont is well known because of the capital city, Montpelier, the region also contains a diverse economy with an interesting industrial history. Granite quarries provide stone for monuments and construction all over the world. Granite workers pass on a tradition of craftsmanship that turns granite slabs into works of art. In addition to its large public sector government employers, the central Vermont area has strong insurance and financial services sectors, and many health care and social assistance employers.

Lamoille County in north central Vermont has a high concentration of service industry jobs related to seasonal recreation and tourism. Recent resort expansion and development has provided construction and retail jobs for the area.

Northeastern Vermont, known as the Northeast Kingdom, contains some of the last remnants of a rural, undeveloped New England. The forests provide income for loggers and serve as a resource for furniture and other wood product manufacturing—a critical part of the regional economy. New technology has created additional market opportunities in renewable energy. Residents of its three counties report income levels among the lowest in the state and poverty rates among the highest.

POPULATION

The 2010 United States' Census confirmed a slow rate of growth in the population of Vermont. Since 2000, Vermont's population has grown in nominal terms by 2.8% over the last ten years which translates to an annual growth rate of less than 0.3%. Comparatively, the United States grew by 9.7% over the same ten year period between 2000 and 2010. Vermont's population is not anticipated to change significantly in the near future. This expectation has raised concerns about an aging workforce.

The stagnant population growth can be seen in more detail at the county level. From 2000 to 2010, three of Vermont's 14 counties experienced population declines. This includes: Essex, Rutland, and Windsor counties.

Three of the four counties experiencing the largest population gains between 2000 and 2010 are part of or are in close proximity to

the Burlington/South Burlington Labor Market Area. They include Chittenden, Lamoille, and Franklin counties with nominal percent changes over the ten year period of 6.8%, 5.4% and 5.1% respectively. The other county with large population growth is Caledonia County at 5.2% making it the third highest rate of growth. The remaining seven counties ranged from marginal growth in Bennington County (0.4%) to modest growth in Orleans County (3.6%) (Table 17).

Chittenden County is home to some of the largest cities and towns in Vermont. Burlington is the state's largest city with a population of 42,417 in 2010. Other large cities and towns in the county are Essex, South Burlington and Colchester. Rutland (Rutland County) and Bennington (Bennington County) are two other cities that have large populations comparable to some of those in Chittenden County (Tables 2-15).

Orleans, Essex and Caledonia counties, which comprise the Northeast Kingdom, remain sparsely populated with the largest towns being St. Johnsbury, Lyndon, Derby, and Newport City. Essex County is the least populated with 6,306 residents in 2010.

The most striking population statistics involve the aging of Vermont. The state has one of the oldest populations in the nation. Between 2000 and 2010, the two age cohorts with the largest percent increase were 55-64 years old and over 65 years old. The aging of the state could present a challenge to Vermont's workforce and health care system (Table 16).

Chittenden County has the lowest proportion of residents over the age of 55 (23.2%), while nine counties (Bennington, Caledonia, Essex, Grand Isle, Orange,

Orleans, Rutland, Windham and Windsor) have in excess of 30% of their populations in the over 55 group. Franklin County has the highest concentration of children – both for children under five (6.3%) and school age children aged 5 to 19 (20.7%) (Table 16).

ECONOMIC TRENDS

Jobs in Vermont increased by 0.2% in 2010 from the prior year as the local and national economy slowly reversed the downward course established during the 'Great Recession' and returned to economic expansion. This rate of change translates to an additional 718 jobs in the state's economy resulting in an overall total of 293,088 jobs (Table 18).

Between 2000 and 2010, the Vermont economy has lost about 3,400 jobs, declining by 1.1% over the ten-year period. Four counties experienced net job growth from 2000 to 2010: Grand Isle (19.9%), Franklin (10.0%), Orleans (3.0%) and Lamoille (0.6%) Counties. The remaining 10 counties all reported net job losses between 2000 and 2010. The range of percent job loss was wide from a 1.0% decline in Addison and Washington Counties to a 36.2% decline in Essex County (Table 1).

Job growth was concentrated in service providing sectors where as goods producing sectors experienced job losses between 2009 and 2010 (+0.6% and -1.4%, respectively). Construction continued to be a sector under pressure and one yet to recover from the recent economic contraction. Covered employment in this sector decreased by 191 jobs or 1.4% (Table 18).

Job growth in service providing sectors reported was an early indication of the economic recovery. The large increase in

Management of Companies and Enterprises does not necessarily constitute new employment to the Vermont economy. Instead, it is more indicative of changes to how the primary function of the Vermont operation(s) is coded as some Vermont-born firms have since expanded globally to merit headquarter operations within the state (Table 18).

The reported declines in employment by county between 2000 and 2010 are as result of the 'Great Recession' which masks the years of strong economic growth during the mid-2000s. While the one year period between 2009 and 2010 was positive for covered employment growth, the magnitude was not sufficient enough to overcome the large declines to covered employment between 2008 and 2009 as a result of the significant national economic downturn (Tables 1 and 18-32).

According to 2010 data, Vermont had a net loss in manufacturing employment by 1.3% compared to the prior year. However, non-durable goods manufacturing did report positive employment over this time period (+0.9%). Food, beverage and licensed beverage manufacturing has been on the rise in Vermont boosting the non-durable manufacturing employment counts.

Between 2009 and 2010, for the counties with data, six counties reported increases in overall manufacturing employment while seven counties reflected the opposite. The county with the largest percent increase was Grand Isle County (27.5%) but due to the region's small size, this large percent increase is not significant. Orleans County experienced the largest percent decline (8.3%) in manufacturing employment over this one year period (Tables 18-32).

Between 2009 and 2010, ten counties reported decreases in construction employment while four counties reflected increases. Windham County had the largest percent increase in construction employment (13.1%). The county with the largest percent decline was Washington County at 8.5% (Tables 18-32).

The state's accommodation and food service employment increased by 2.4% which equals 676 jobs. On a county level, employment in this sector declined in four counties while ten experienced gains. On a percentage basis, Orange County had the largest decline (-8.0%) and Essex County had the largest percent increase (18.4%) (Tables 18-32).

Vermont's agricultural base has experienced a lot of changes in recent decades due to the modernization of daily operations and more recently from weather related events. The latest agriculture statistics come from the 2007 Census of Agriculture. The number of hired agricultural workers increased by 9.3% between 2002 and 2007. Over this same time period, Vermont's farm acreage declined nearly 1%. Rutland and Washington counties experienced the greatest increases in hired workers - each increasing by approximately two thirds during the five-year period. All fourteen counties experienced increases in agricultural products and dairy products sold. Dairy farming still dominates the state's agricultural sector and contributes to its non-durable goods manufacturing sector (Table 33).

The state's forest industry decreased total production between 2009 and 2010 – with both hardwood and softwood harvests reporting declines during this time period. Windham, Rutland and Windsor Counties

produced the most hardwood in Vermont in 2010 (in that order). Essex and Orleans produced the most softwood (Table 34).

Unemployment

As a result of the recent recession, Vermont's unemployment rate continues to remain elevated compared to the state's historic levels over the past two decades. Nonetheless, the state level is still well below the national unemployment rate and is currently (June 2012) ranked as fourth lowest in the nation. The state's unemployment rate averaged 5.6% in 2011 which is down from 6.4% in 2010. Across the counties, unemployment in 2011 ranged from 4.4% in Chittenden County to 8.1% in Orleans County. The average unemployment rates in Addison, Chittenden, Franklin, Orange, Washington and Windsor counties were below the statewide unemployment rate (Tables 1 and 18).

Wages

The average annual wage in Vermont rose in 2010 reaching a level of \$39,425 which represents an increase of 1.7% over 2009 levels. Wages continue to be higher in Chittenden County where the annual wage was 17% higher than the statewide average. Washington County is the only other county to have an average wage above the state-wide average.

Average annual wages ranged from a high of \$46,213 in Chittenden County to a low of \$30,893 in Essex County. Average wages are influenced not only by the mix of industries and occupations in an area, but also other economic factors such as the proportion of part-time and seasonal jobs. Although they may pay a competitive hourly wage, part-time and seasonal jobs would

lower the annual average versus a full-time job, all else equal (Table 1).

In 2010, Vermont's per capita income of \$40,134 reflects a 2.4% increase over 2009 levels. Per capita income is equal to total personal income divided by total resident population. It is a broader measure of financial well-being than wages, because it includes various non-wage items such as dividends, rents and government transfer payments. Income is based on the resident population, while the average wage is reported by the employer paying the wages (Table 1).

Vermont's median adjusted income was \$32,501 in 2010, an increase of 2.1% from 2009. This measure comes from income tax return data, and it is influenced by the mix of single and multiple income households. The number of towns with median adjusted incomes of over \$40,000 in 2010 was 35; a rise of 6 from the previous year's count (Tables 2-15).

Taxes

As in years past, over one-third of Vermont's personal income taxes came from the residents of Chittenden County in 2010. The combination of Chittenden's large population and relatively high income levels result in large revenue generation from the county. Windsor County had the second highest personal income tax revenue with 9.8% of the state's total. Chittenden County also contributed the most to the state's sales and use taxes (27.3%), rooms and meals taxes (28.4%), and property transfer taxes (33.9%). Rutland County was the second highest contributor to sales and use taxes with a 10.0% share of the state's total. Windsor County was the second largest contributor to rooms and meals taxes (10.1% of state total).

Lastly, Lamoille was the second largest contributor to property transfer taxes with 11.6% of state totals (Table 35).

Local property taxes fund municipal expenses, road maintenance and local education. A statewide property tax is the foundation of education financing in the state. For the purposes of education funding, all real property is classified as either homestead or nonresidential. A statewide education tax is imposed on these two classes of property at different rates. The homestead education tax rate in each municipality depends upon the local per pupil spending. Both the homestead and nonresidential education tax rates are adjusted by the local common level of appraisal of the property. Tables 2-15 show the latest homestead tax rates for towns in Vermont. HOUSING

The number of year-round homes sold in Vermont in 2011 was 4,804 which was well below the transaction activity in 2005 (9,312 units). The median price of year-round homes increased over this period. The statewide median price of a year-round home was \$195,000 in 2011, up from \$185,000 in 2005. This figure includes all types of single-family dwellings including mobile homes. Chittenden County had the highest median price at \$245,000; up from \$230,000 in 2005. The fastest growing prices were found in Essex County and Washington County where median home sale prices increased by 25.9% and 14.1%, respectively, over the six-year period between 2005 to 2011. Five counties (Bennington, Grand Isle, Rutland, Windham and Windsor) reported declines in

median sale prices of year round homes over the same time period (Table 36).

The number of annual vacation home sales decreased by nearly 50% in 2011 versus 2005. In addition, the median sale price for these properties decreased by 4.3% over this time period. The median sale price of vacation homes grew in six counties (Addison, Chittenden, Grand Isle, Lamoille, Orange and Washington) while the other nine experienced a decline or no change (Table 36).

EDUCATION

Vermont school enrollment has been declining since 1997. In fiscal year (FY) 2011, Vermont's high schools had a combined enrollment of 27,771 students - a drop of 4.8% from FY 2010. High school enrollment figures by county reflect the school age population data by county. Dropout rates, an average over the latest three fiscal years, vary widely across schools - from a 0.6% rate for Stowe and Harwood High Schools to an 8.1% rate for Springfield High School. Overall, the statewide dropout rate for high school students averaged 2.8% for the three-year period ending in FY 2011. This level represents a decrease of one-tenth of a percent from the prior three-year period ending in FY 2010 (Table 37).

The average student-teacher ratio in Vermont was 10.9 in FY 2011, which is a minor decrease (0.1) from FY 2010. Student-teacher ratios ranged from 7.5 at Chelsea High School in Orange County up to 17.0 at Mt. Mansfield Union High School in Chittenden County (Table 37).

High school student achievement levels in math, reading, science and writing also varied across counties and within counties.

Student performance on standardized tests given in grade 11 in FY 2011 are presented in Table 38.

As a state, 3% of the tested high school population were able to demonstrate Proficient with Distinction (level 4) for math. Overall across the state, 39% of students tested at Substantially Below Proficiency (level 1) in math. Conversely, reading and writing - each had the largest cohort of students testing within the Proficient (level 3) range with 42% and 43% of the tested population, respectively. In science, 43% of students tested performed at the level of Partially Proficient (level 2).

At 16 of 57 high schools (nearly one-third of high schools with reported data), 50% or more of the students tested performed at Substantially Below Proficiency (level 1) in math. At 22 of 60 high schools (over one-third of high schools with reported data), 33% or more of the students tested performed at Substantially Below Proficiency (level 1) in science. (Table 38).









GLOSSARY

ADJUSTED GROSS INCOME (AGI) is the value an individual reports on their state income tax. The Vermont Department of Taxes provides the data reported in this publication.

* As noted by the Tax Department: This data is provided for historical continuity with previous tax reports. Median AGI for all tax returns is an inappropriate measure of central tendency because it is so dependent on the mix of single and dual incomes within a town.

Determination of median AGI for all tax returns by town was required by VSA Title 16, Section 3480 in 1981 to assist in computation of aid to education. In 1987 this statute section was amended to specify determination of average AGI per exemption. The entire section was repealed in 1997 as part of Act 60.

AGE COHORT is an age grouping that is an aggregate of sequential years of age. For example, one group might be all persons between the ages 5-14.

ANNUAL AVERAGE WAGE is the average wage paid by all firms covered under Vermont's unemployment compensation law. The average wage is computed by dividing the total wages paid during the year by the average employment.

COVERED EMPLOYMENT in this publication includes the employment of both public and private employers covered by the unemployment compensation law. The data is gathered from reports submitted by employers each quarter and is aggregated into industries as defined by the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). The major groups of employers excluded from coverage are most agricultural production firms and the self-employed.

EDUCATION

ASSESSMENTS are the New England Common Assessment Program (NECAP) exams, given to Vermont public school students in grades three through eight and eleven. The NECAP exams were designed specifically to assess how well Vermont students have learned the skills and content contained in *Vermont's Framework of Standards and Learning Opportunities*. This is the fourth year of results on the NECAP exams for grades three through eight and the second year for grade eleven.

COHORT GRADUATION RATE is calculated by tracking the students from the time they enter grade nine. Students who graduate within four years are considered on-time graduates. The number of on-time graduates is divided by the total number of students in the cohort. Students who transfer into a school are included in the cohort, while students who transfer out are dropped from the cohort. For the 2009 graduation rate, all students that entered grade nine in 2005 are included in the cohort.

$$\text{Cohort Graduation Rate} = \frac{\text{On-time Graduates By Year X}}{\text{(First-time Entering Ninth Graders in Year X-4) + (Transfers In) - (Transfers Out)}}$$

GLOSSARY continued

EDUCATION (continued)

DROP OUT RATE is a three year average of the percentage of students who leave high school during the school year and the preceding summer. Enrollment figures used in calculating this rate have been adjusted for transfers and deaths.

ENROLLMENT is an annual head count as of October 1st. The enrollment report is organized by school, grade, ethnicity and gender break down.

EFFECTIVE HOMESTEAD TAX RATE: The tax rate levied on residential (homestead) property is adjusted upward if the residents of that school district decide to spend more than the “base education payment.” The base education payment was \$6,800 per pupil for tax year 2004. Here’s an example of how the rate is adjusted.

Say your local school budget provided for spending of \$7,820 per pupil. The homestead tax rate of \$1.05 was adjusted upward before the common level of appraisal adjustment was applied. It will be higher in proportion to the amount your voters decided to spend over \$6,800 per pupil. In this example, the adjustment was: $\$7,820/\$6,800 = 1.15$

EMPLOYMENT in this publication is measured by Covered Employment and Labor Force. Covered Employment is based upon where the job is located. Labor Force is based upon where the worker resides. See Covered Employment and Labor Force for further information.

HOME SALES are the number of homes sold in Vermont by county. This includes all single family homes, condos and mobile homes sold with and without land. The home value reflects the median price of homes sold in that county.

LABOR FORCE data measures the labor force status of the area's residents who are 16 years of age or older. The residents may work, look for work, or be unemployed from firms in areas other than where they reside. The estimates include agricultural workers, unpaid family members and the self-employed.

MEDIAN is a statistical term. Data is put in numeral order. The median is the middle term. Fifty percent of the data fall above the median and fifty percent fall below the median.

PER CAPITA INCOME data for the state and counties is based on estimates from the Bureau of Economic Analysis of the U.S. Department of Commerce.
